### A great place to have a cow

Solanco Fair kicks off with bovine royalty, parade

LANCASTER COUNTY, PA - Wentworth Farm Laro Valencia enjoys the Southern Lancaster County Community Fair.

But the red- and white-spotted Ayrshire cow thinks the 57th annual event that kicked off Wednesday is a little out of whack.

More people come to watch the parade and eat funnel cakes and milkshakes than to check out the main attraction — her.

After all, she's bovine royalty: the daughter of Des Chamois Pat Laro and Wentworth Farm Sweet Vidalia 90 2E. The numbers behind her mom's name means she was rated 90/100 two straight years, a lofty accomplishment.

But are Donald and Sandra Hart of Lancaster interested in her? No. They are salivating over the canned fruits and vegetables a barn away from Valencia.

The Harts try to visit most of the fairs in the county every year, mainly to see the best competitive entries.

Hmmph, Valencia snorts.

The registered Ayrshire purebred garnered blue and red ribbons in the fair's dairy contest, despite being eight months pregnant and losing her lean figure.

The 3-year-old — a junior champion heifer at the 2004 Goshen Fair in Chester County — would have stomped off with two blue ribbons if it wasn't for that 11-year-old hussy with the larger udder.

In a nearby field, Freeman Taylor, 77, of Nottingham, was preparing his 1930 Ford Model A Coupe for the parade.

"All original except for the seats," Taylor noted.

And Katie Hall, 13, New Providence, and McKenzie Linden, 13, and Andrew Linden, 7, both of Lancaster, were busy manning The

Wentworth Farm Laro Valencia doesn't feel like a prisoner, despite the rope harness around her neck.

Rob and Bonnie Wentworth of River Road, Quarryville, and their twin 16-year-old children, Hannah and Ethan, provide dry straw for Valencia's bed. Also, a special treat for the fair: beet pulp shreds with molasses. Mmmm.

Of the dairy family's eight heifers and six cows at the fair, Valencia is on the end, the most visible spot. She doesn't think that was an accident.

Only problem is she's right next to Daisy, who could use a lesson in manners from Valencia, according to Ethan. Daisy almost kicked the teen when he tried to clip her.

Valencia takes all the pampering in stride. Sometimes, she thinks she has more in common with the majestic Percheron draft horses, like the ones pulling carriages in the nearby parade.

The working mother scoffs at the numerous animals who make a fool out of themselves for attention.

Take Dolly, one of the horses in the parade group, the Drumore Outlaws. Dolly's hooves were painted pink and she donned a light green bikini.

No, Valencia commands attention like Solanco High School drum major Heather Eisenberger.

The 16-year-old junior, dressed to the hilt, led the band with style.

Style also resided in one of the commercial tents.

Clint Greer of Peach Bottom is pitching his Little Pines Country Log Homes from an impressive booth made with 18 logs and three 22-inch-wide slabs of white pine.

But Valencia prefers the dairy barn, where the heart of Lancaster County's agriculture industry resides. Cows like Valencia do their part in making Pennsylvania the fourth largest dairy producer.

Many visitors skip it.

But just when Valencia is about to get bitter, Dylan Carpenter walks up to her.

The 4-year-old New Providence boy went straight to the cows when he got to the fair and chose Valencia as the one cow to approach and pet.

"He loves cows," his mother says.

Now there's a boy with a head on his shoulders, Valencia thinks.

The fair continues through Friday at the fairgrounds off Route 472 in Quarryville.

Today, the fair features a Holstein steer feeder calf show at 5 p.m., tractor pulling at 6 p.m., beef judging and a baby parade at 7 p.m., and tug of war at 7:30 p.m.

Friday features tractor driving and milking contests, youth awards, livestock sale, pedal tractor pull and iron man contest.

Oh, and don't forget to say hello to Wentworth Farm Laro
